William Grant Still (1895-1978)

Danzas de Panama I. Tamborito III. Punto

William Grant Still is one of the most successful American composers of the 20th century. In addition to his prolific output, he stands out as the first African-American in the United States to have his music performed by a major symphony orchestra and the first to conduct the Los Angeles Philharmonic in 1936. Still's music follows in the footsteps of composers such as Bartók and Dvořák who sought to fuse elements of folk and popular music with Classical traditions. *Danzas de Panama* was written in 1948 and is based on a series of Panamanian folk tunes set to four traditional dance forms. *Tamborito* is the national folk song and dance of Panama. It is a high-energy dance that pairs a lover's melody with lively percussion. *Punto* is yet another couple's dance that begins slowly with many graceful spins then, as the music progresses, gives way to complex footwork. In this work, William Grant Still transforms the string orchestra into not only a folk band complete with guitars and percussion, but the dancers themselves.

The Last Transmissions of Amelia Earhart

Blending visual art, music, and soundscape, LaBanca has created an "intentionally vague" piece using a poem written by the pioneering aviator, Amelia Earhart (1897-1937?), along with confirmed and unconfirmed radio transmissions from her disappearance over the Pacific Ocean. Earhart submitted poems to literary magazines, like the one used in this piece: "Merciless life / Laughs in the burning sun / And only death / Slow-circling down / Shadows with buzzard wings / The arid flesh / Burned before the passion paws of love." Concert Choir members led the interpretation of this 'graphic score' (the entirety of which is projected for you tonight): sheet music that is filled with pictures, shapes, words, bits of music, intending to "create a sense of disorientation, confusion, and isolation."

L'estro Armonico was a set of 12 concertos that Vivaldi wrote and published in 1711. This particular movement comes from the sixth concerto and was originally written for solo violin and strings.

Piazzolla is one of Argentina's most well-known composers and is credited with developing the Tango Nuevo (new tango) where he blended traditional tango elements with both classical music as well as jazz. Libertango is perhaps Piazzolla's most famous piece and can be commonly heard in fancy concert halls all the way to a dingy jazz club. In addition to the melody and parts of this piece, you will also hear a section with improvised solos, a common element heard in Piazzolla's music.

Marsha is credited with being one of the instigators of the famous Stonewall uprising of June 28, 1969 – one of the pivotal events of the LGBTQ liberation movement of the 20th century. This piece was written in 2019 for the Desert Winds Freedom Band.

Steampunk Suite

IV. Barnum & Tesla's Tandem Bicycle

Written in four movements, Steampunk Suite attempts to depict various scenes that take place in a fictional alternate history that features notable people alive in the Victorian era, including Charles Ives, Marie Curie, H.G. Wells, Jules Verne, P.T. Barnum, and Nikola Tesla. It borrows from popular music of the era, including the cakewalk, march, and waltz. These are combined with sounds of clockwork, and imagined steam technology. It also borrows various musical elements from numerous composers of the time, including Ives, Sousa, Satie, Stravinsky, and Khachaturian. The composer, Erika Svanoe, is currently the band director and music faculty at Augsburg University in Minneapolis.

Tho' your soul may be tired, with hope you'll be inspired when you sing our freedom song. Freedom song. Freedom song! *Freedom Song* was composed in the key of B minor, which in this case represents perseverance. The introduction sets a meditative mood, yet a slight hint of dissonance is present. The first melody features the guitar ensemble, and paints a scene of the hopeful, yet naive, aspirations that have often become great accomplishments. As the beat of the world drumming ensemble enters, native cultures and the essential universal heartbeat of the drum is presented. A myriad of musical influences and emotions flow throughout this section. The piece builds to an all-encompassing chorus of voices, past and present, who sing of the fundamentals of existence; hope and freedom. The finale brings us to a vast horizon where the ancestors and generations of people gather to envision the future of our land, and planet Earth.

Adi Yeshaya is an Israeli-American composer, arranger and jazz pianist. Renowned for his musical mastery and loved for his collaborative spirit, he has spent the last 40 years working in almost every aspect of the music industry, including theater, film, television and recording. He has collaborated with some of the world's biggest musical stars, doing arrangements for such artists as Prince, Whitney Houston, Aretha Franklin, Burt Bacharach and Lena Horne. Born and raised in Israel, Adi had a strong aspiration to become a composer from a young age. His rare persistence and natural talent enabled him to study with two acclaimed musicians in Israel – arranger Alex Weiss and jazz pianist and educator Dr. Zvi Kirn. Their mentorship helped pave his way to the world-renowned Berklee College of Music in Boston, where he graduated Magna Cum Laude. Now based in Minneapolis, Adi has worked with the world-renowned Guthrie Theater, the Grammywinning Minnesota Orchestra and among other film and television work, has done musical arrangements for NBC's The Voice. For over 20 years, he has worked with Rebecca Arons on STRINGenius – a performance, arranging, production and recording company, which has worked on instrumental tracks for such artists as Prince, Judith Hill and Rita Ora. He has taught at the University of Minnesota, McNally Smith College of Music and Berklee College of Music.

Marissa Dodge is a composer, lyricist, vocalist, musician, and producer. Throughout her fifty year career, her music has been performed and recorded by award-winning artists; Lena Horne, Karrin Allyson, Ed Reed, Debbie Duncan, Dennis Spears, Sandra Booker, Bruce Henry, to name a few. Marissa was born into a musical family, near the shores of Lake Superior in Duluth, Minnesota. Though her roots were firmly planted in Jazz, she branched out into several styles of music. She is a music educator, and also writes about music.
